ASCAP Submissions: Do the Right Thing.

Did you know that US Copyright Law states that composers must receive a royalty when their work is performed? ASCAP protects the rights of its members by licensing and distributing royalties for the performances of copyrighted works.

ASCAP members make their living writing music, many of whom are also MTAC members. ASCAP exists to ensure that music creators are paid when their works are performed publicly. Rental or purchase of sheet music does not authorize its public performance.

MTAC has an ASCAP Copyright License, and covers each and every MTAC member for all branch and individual performances. However, in order for ASCAP members to receive royalties from the performances of their works, we must submit programs to the state office. This is where I need your help.

Throughout the 2019-2020 season, I'll collect TWO copies of each program and send them to the MTAC state office on June 30. As a reminder, these can be studio recitals, masterclasses, festival, and any other performances.

For the convenience of our branch members, there are several ways to submit your programs:

- 1. Send them to or drop them off at my home: Caitlin Boruch, 1258 Rotella Street in Newbury Park, CA 91320.
- 2. Give them to me if you see me in any capacity (MTAC festivals, performances, around town). It is the responsibility of the festival chairs to turn in the programs, but at the festivals where my students perform, I'm happy to arrange to pick up the two copies of every performance.
- 3. Collect them throughout the season and hand them to me at the MTAC luncheon and general meeting in May.

Thank you for your help in ensuring our composers collect the income they have earned.


Review by Fred Beerstein..

Pianist, Susan Ellinger presented a concert and seminar sponsored by the Music Teacher's Association of California Conejo Valley Branch at the Hillcrest Center of the Arts onThursday, October 24, 10 AM. The program explored a program of works exploring Haydn, Mozart and Beethoven and their influence on Claude Debussy's refined and elegant impressionistic French 'classicism'. The paired pieces were presented as couplets without interrupting applause. Ellinger allowed the pared impressionist pieces to show connection and homage to the earlier paired work. The performances were exhilarating as well as thoughtful. Among the pieces performed d'anacapri (The Hills of Anacapri) Debussy paired with the Piano Sonata No. 18 in D major, K 576, Mozart. We also heard La Cathédrale engloutie (The Sunken Cathedral), Debussy paired with the Piano Sonata in A Flat Major, Op. 110, Beethoven. This listener walked on air following the conclusion of the performance.



Dear Teachers,

The **VOCE Application Portal** will open on **November 1, 2019**. Refer to the **VOCE Guidelines** found on your Teacher Portal for information about important dates, categories and eligibility requirements.

This year, the application period dates have changed, so please review the deadlines below.

Enrollment Period:

The VOCE enrollment period is from **November 1** to **December 1**, **2019**. No applications can be created after **December 1**, **at 11:59 P.M.** You will be able to make edits to applications up until **December 15**, **2019**.

You can add a student to your Student Roster at this time. Once the student is added to your roster, you can create the VOCE application.

Proof of Age:

MTAC requires proof of age of the student to be provided by the parent (or student if over 18) by **November 1, 2019**. Since VOCE has different age divisions, the ages of all participants must be submitted and verified before the deadline. Click here to see more information about the verification process.

Payment Period:

Parents are able to make a payment once the application is created and the age has been verified. The deadline to make the payment is **December 15, 2019.**

A Note about Arias:

Please note that Arias will not be permitted in the Intermediate Age Division for Solo Voice performers. Review the VOCE guidelines to see the full Solo Voice repertoire requirements.

For additional help please contact your VOCE Branch Chair or Branch President.

If your Branch does not host its own audition, the VOCE State Chairs, **Tina Yoo**, VOCE State Chair South, or **Kathy You Wilson**, VOCE State Chair North, will help your Branch coordinate with a neighboring Branch to host an audition.

We are excited to hold MTAC Conejo Valley branch's first pilot sight-reading festival!

The objective of the *Prima Vista Festival* is to motivate students to improve their sight-reading abilities as well as prepare for the sight-reading portion of their Certificate of Merit exam. Students from Preparatory to Level 6 will be given 2 examples with a 30 second preview time per example. Students Level 7 and above will be given 1 example; Level 7 students will have preview time of 30 seconds;
