Registration for the 2019 Women Composers Festival is now open!

The festival will be held on Sunday, September 22, at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Thousand Oaks. The first recital will begin at 2:15 or 2:30, and we will go on from there. This festival is open to students of all instruments and voice, and of all levels. Chamber music as well as solo pieces are welcome. The only requirement is that the piece(s) be written by a woman composer. Memorization is optional and there is no time limit for pieces. Students will introduce the composer before performing. Three to four sentences are enough, but more is also ok. Teachers should of course vet what their students are going to say. Students should dress up, adhering to our branch's recital guidelines.

When registering your students, please be sure to be accurate and complete when listing the dates of the composer. Examples of format are 1700-1750, or for living composers, b. 1972. Sometimes the dates are unknown or approximate - for example the composer Anna Bon di Venezia was probably born in 1740, but after 1767 we don't know what happened to her, although it is pretty clear she lived past that date. So, her dates would be listed as 1740-after 1767. Please do not make up dates. Do the research, or have your students do the research. If I have to do the research or contact you to find out the correct dates, I will be very annoyed. (And you won't like me when I am annoyed.)

The registration deadline is Friday, September 6 at 5:00 pm. The registration fee is \$14 per student. Teachers will pay through our branch's website. I am just getting this information to Tachell, so please wait awhile before submitting payment. The deadline for payment is September 13. You can, however, go ahead and register your students at this link: https://forms.gle/83kJACSuhKezyXzGA or on the website.

About the composer:

Marie Jaëll (née Trautmann) was a French pianist and composer who lived from 1846-1925. Marie Trautmann was a gifted pianist who attended the Paris Conservatory. In 1862 she was awarded a first prize. She concertized throughout Europe and was the first pianist to perform all of the Beethoven Piano Sonatas. She married fellow pianist Alfred Jaëll in 1866. The two toured Europe, Russia, and the United States. Alfred died in 1882 when Marie was 35 years old—incidentally the same year that this concerto was composed. After her husband's death, she studied musical composition regularly with Camille Saint-Saëns and was close friends with Franz Liszt who, along with Saint-Saens, performed her pieces for four hands. Marie Jaëll was one of the first women admitted into the Societe des Compositeurs de Music. Her manuscripts are housed in the Bibliothèque Nationale et Universitaire de Strasbourg.

Notes from the editor:

For many months I've been busy making the first published edition of a cello concerto by Marie Jaell. It's lots of fun to play, has beautiful melodies, and enough technical challenges to make it interesting. I hope you will check it out for yourself or an advanced student (about Saint-Saens level)



What's new for 2019- 2020 year?

The application period for the VOCE auditions will be open from November 1, 2019 through December 1, 2019. All applications need to be created by December 1. Teachers can edit unpaid applications through December 15, 2019.

The student's age does need to be verified before a payment can be made. Parents will have until December 15, 2019 to submit a payment. Edits to applications cannot be made after the payment has been made.

PRIMA VISTA FESITVAL

We are excited to hold MTAC Conejo Valley branch's first pilot sight-reading festival!

The objective of the *Prima Vista Festival* is to motivate students to improve their sight-reading abilities as well as prepare for the sight-reading portion of their Certificate of Merit exam. Students from Preparatory to Level 6 will be given 2 examples with a 30 second preview time per example. Students Level 7 and above will be given 1 example; Level 7 students will have preview time of 30 seconds;
